Senate President Steve Morris Announces New Legislative Director

Travis Lowe Joins Republican Leadership Staff with Focus on Redistricting

Topeka – Senate President Steve Morris today announced that Lawrence resident Travis Lowe has been hired to serve as the President's Legislative Director. Lowe succeeds Joshua Lewis who recently was named Chief of Staff in the President's Office.

Morris stated, "I am pleased to announce that Travis Lowe is joining my staff as Legislative Director. For the next several months, his focus will be on assisting me and the Republican caucus with the redistricting process as well as other policy issues that arise. We are fortunate to add another experienced and capable member to our staff."

Lowe will work with the redistricting committee and directly with individual Republican senators to draw maps reflecting their visions for future political district boundaries to more accurately reflect census population data across the state. Lowe's first official day on the job was Monday, Aug. 15th.

Travis Lowe is no stranger to the legislative process. Before graduating from the University of Kansas with a degree in political science, Lowe served as an intern for Senator Jay Emler who is now the Senate Majority Leader. Since graduation, he has worked for two major lobbying firms, Pinegar, Smith and Associates; and Little Government Relations, LLC.

Originally from the Dallas/Ft. Worth area in Texas, Mr. Lowe came to Kansas to attend KU. His parents, Kenneth and Cindy Lowe, now reside in Garnett, Kan., with Travis' three younger brothers.
